Why are we asking business to engage with schools and colleges?

- Research shows young people who have four or more encounters with the world of work during their time at school or college are 86% less likely to become NEET (not in education, employment or training) and have higher earning potential.

- Construction (trade professions, civil engineering, architects)

# How can you get involved?

Type of activity	Description	Key details including length of commitment, where activity takes place, how long activity takes
Talks	One-hour sessions/talks on career opportunities in your sector.	Delivered in a school or college, these sessions last the length of a class and you can either develop the session yourself or use one of our template lesson plans which are facilitated by the teacher
Workplace/Site Visits	Host a group of pupils at your workplace.  Whilst on the workplace visit students could work on a project in your office, meet your staff and find out about their job roles, have a tour of your office or factory. The aim is to show students what you do, how you do it and how they could do it too.	<ul> <li>Can be a one off ½ day activity or repeated throughout the year depending on your capacity</li> <li>Activity takes place at your workplace with as many students you're able to host</li> <li>You'll be supported by your local Enterprise Coordinator to plan an activity that works for you and the needs of the local students</li> </ul>
Employability "Taster" sessions	Interactive sessions which give young people an idea of the types of jobs, and skills required, in different work environments.	<ul> <li>Typically, a 1-2-hour activity delivered to a class of young people, which brings to life an element of your work.</li> <li>Session can take place either in a school or college or at your workplace</li> <li>Could include CV writing and interviews</li> </ul>
Mentoring	Work with individual pupils over an extended period to support them through their education journey and career aspirations.	If you'd like to support a young person on a regular, long term basis through mentoring then we'll introduce you to a local mentoring organisation who will match your requirements with the needs of local young people
